Current Chamber Projects

The following are some of the Chamber projects that have either been achieved, or are work in progress or are to be done in the near future.

■ Projects Achieved

In 2002 Egham Chamber got involved in the **Runnymede Chamber Network Lunches**, these are going from strength to strength and are a valued way to network your business to other business people in the area.

The Committee has produced this **business pack** to encourage new members to our organisation as well as to aid our current members.

The Chamber successfully erects the **Christmas lights** in Egham town centre each year, but raising the funds needed for this each year is getting harder to do, any support or help with this would be gratefully received.

The Chamber, with the help of the Runnymede Business Partnership, produce the **Egham Town Centre Guide** on a bi annual basis, which is widely distributed in the area, for example, to many local businesses, Royal Holloway and Strodes Colleges, the library, etc.

To sponsor two business prizes at **Strodes College Prize Giving** Evening each year.

■ Work in Progress

The Chamber Committee are working hard to increase the membership of the Chamber, which will ensure that the Chamber continues to be seen as a valid business organisation in Runnymede. We would welcome help with this initiative and would welcome new Committee members.

The Chamber work closely with Runnymede Borough Councils planning department to ensure that the retail core of the town centre is retained and no planning application is passed that will reduce commerce growth in the area.

The Committee helped with the completion of the Local Development Framework and made a presentation to RBC to ensure that it's views were represented. The new LDF can be viewed on RBC website: www.runnymede.gov.uk

The Chamber is encouraging it's members to work to improve the image of the working and social environment in the area; ideas are being forwarded and reviewed for action. The main objective is to ensure the image of Egham is one of a place to do business in.

The Committee are working with a market company with the hope of introducing occasional farmers market and specialist markets to visit our town on a regular basis to encourage people into the town, to provide them with a greater variety of retail outlets and so ensure the economic growth of the town.

■ Future Projects

To increase it's provision of services for businesses.

To continue to support and help with the organisation of the Magna Carta Day, which is growing in size year on year and is seen as a vital annual event for the town.

To continue to work with all local business, Council, Police and community organisations to ensure the continued growth and prosperity of the area in every aspect.
